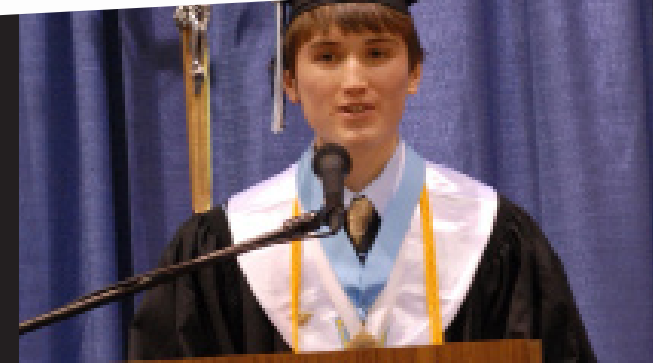

Graduate earns Eagle Scout Award

Alexander Richard Silvano Tombelli received the Eagle Scout Award, the Boy Scouts of America's highest achievement, on Sunday, May 31. The Court of Honor ceremony was held at St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Church.

To achieve the Eagle Rank, a Scout must demonstrate leadership and citizenship while earning 21 Merit Badges before reaching the age of 18 years. He must complete a service project for the benefit of his community. As a member of Boy Scouts of America Troop 109, Okemos, and during his enrollment at LCHS, Alexander completed a service project to design, manage the building of and oversee the completion of a Stations of the Cross meditation and prayer garden at LCHS. This included 14 mounted stations connected by a walking pebble path and other features including a berm, shrubbery, and benches. Alexander and 25 volunteers worked 240 hours, including 113 planning hours, to design, discuss, fundraise, construct and complete the Stations of the Cross garden.

Alexander is a graduate of LCHS Class of 2008, and just completed his first year at Thomas Aquinas College in Santa Paula, California.

Asbestos Report

The Environmental Protection Agency requires inspection of any building containing materials to be inspected every three years. Our building was inspected the summer of 2006. Pesticide Report

We are in compliance with the Michigan Department of Agriculture, Pesticide & Plant Management Division regulations. If you would like to be notified when chemicals are being used at LCHS, please call Clint Wheeler, property manager, at 267-2198.

Notice of Disclosure of School Directory Information

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a federal law that requires the school district, with certain exceptions, to obtain your written consent prior to the disclosure of personally identifiable information from your child's educational records. However, the school may disclose some student information without written consent when the information is designated "Directory Information" unless you have advised the school in writing to the contrary.

The primary use for Directory Information by the district is to include this type of information in certain school publications. It is generally not considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if released. Examples of school publications are: a playbill or program showing your child's role in a drama or music production, yearbook, honor roll or other recognition lists published in school or in newspapers, graduation programs, school/student directory, school website, sports statistics listed in programs which may include height and weight of team members.

Directory information may also be disclosed to outside organizations without a parent's prior written consent. Outside organizations include, but are not limited to: other schools the student is seeking to attend (transcripts, etc), class ring manufacturers, state or federal requests for evaluating programs, court order subpoena.

Two federal laws require schools that receive assistance under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 to provide military recruiters, upon request, with three Directory Information categories: names, addresses and phone numbers. Private schools may request that families which are interested in having information released to military recruiters indicate so on the school application. Only those names given to the school will be released to military recruiters.

If you do NOT want LCHS to disclose Directory Information about your child without your prior written consent, you must notify the school in writing including what information may not be released.

College Planning Update

Parents:

1. There will be a College Planning 101 Workshop for Parents. This workshop is open to all parents, grades 9-12 on Wednesday, September 9, 7-9 p.m. in the cafeteria. No registration required. Each family will also receive an updated college planning guide edited by Dr. Bernier. Visitors are welcome.

2. There will be a College Financial Aid Workshop for Parents, open to all parents, grades 9-12 on Thursday, December 3, 7-9 p.m. in the cafeteria. No registration required. Each family will also receive an updated college financial aid guide edited by Dr. Bernier. Visitors are welcome.

Seniors:

1. Each senior should have met with Dr. Bernier and completed on-campus visits by the end of the summer regarding their college intentions. Based largely on these visits, each student should have a list of two or more colleges he/she wants to apply to. OCTOBER 15 is the recommended deadline to submit applications to the student's top choices. Most applications are done on-line as this method is much faster than the paper application. After submitting each application, the student MUST give the "counselor's page" from each college, as well as, an updated resume to Dr. Bernier. Dr. B is responsible for completing and submitting the "counselor's page", transcript, test scores and the updated resume to each

From the Tuition Office...

Tuition

Individual tuition payment plans were mailed to all registered school families before the end of June. Tuition payments for the new school year began July 15 and continue through May, 2010. All tuition payments are due by the 15th of each month. Payments not received in the school office by the 20th of the month will incur a late fee of \$15.

Parish Subsidy

If you indicated on your Tuition Calculation Worksheet that you would be receiving a tuition subsidy from your parish, your tuition plan was based on that information. In order to receive that subsidy for the 09/10 school year, you must contact your parish office for approval. Please be aware of your parish's procedures for handling subsidy requests. All parish subsidy approvals are due in the school tuition office by September 30, 2009.

T.R.I.P. (Tuition Reduction Incentive Program)

Start using the T.R.I.P. program today and you could earn hundreds of dollars of tuition credit toward your future tuition costs at Lansing Catholic. Information packets are available in the school office. T.R.I.P. credits being earned now through November 30 will be applied to the tuition accounts in early December.

Please note: If the credit amount earned in a six month period is less than \$10, it will not be posted to your tuition account and will be retained by Lansing Catholic. All credits are posted as designated on your T.R.I.P. registration form. If you leave the school, the accrued credits are not transferable or refundable. T.R.I.P. or scrip credits earned at other area parishes or schools and forwarded to Lansing Catholic on your behalf are treated like tuition payments on



your account. If you have questions about the amount of those credits or when they will be applied to your account, please call the T.R.I.P./scrip coordinator at your parish.

Meijer Community Rewards

Families who are registered in the Lansing Catholic T.R.I.P. program may apply directly to Meijer and participate in the Meijer Community Rewards program. Applications are available at Meijer, or online at www.meijer.com/rewards. The code # to designate your credit to Lansing

Catholic is 775130. Credits earned through the Meijer program (less 10%) will be credited to personal tuition accounts as designated in the T.R.I.P. program. These credits will be posted two times annually in the same manner as T.R.I.P. credits. Credits less than \$10 in a six month period will not be posted to tuition accounts. As with T.R.I.P., credits earned will be applied as designated and are not transferable or refundable. Friends and relatives can earn credit to be applied to your account but they must link to your Meijer credit card through the Meijer application. Remember, in order to receive personal tuition credit from the Meijer Community Rewards program, you must be a registered member of Lansing Catholic's T.R.I.P. program. Whether earning personal credit or general school credit, all families are encouraged to use the Meijer Community Rewards program.

2. Seniors must be reminded to maintain their grades throughout the senior year. Colleges usually red-flag a drop in grades, and will frequently rescind a decision to admit a student.

Juniors:

1. The Practice "ACT with Writing" Test Preparation Workshop is on Wednesday, January 6 from 7-11 a.m. in the cafeteria. This workshop helps prepare the students for the March "real" ACT test. It is mandatory for all juniors and is free.

2. The College Planning Quarter will take place January 25-March 26. Students will complete all stages of the college planning process, culminated by a 1:1 private consultation with Dr. Bernier. It is mandatory for all juniors and it will be graded as a part of their Theology class.

Sophomores and Freshmen:

1. Dr. Bernier will meet with both classes through a regular classroom, after the first semester grades are posted. Each student will be asked to complete a Student Information Profile and a Resume. In March, the sophomores will take the Plan test (sophomore version of the ACT) and the freshmen will take the Explore test (freshman version of the ACT).
